- The **Cyberbullying Research Center** is a clearinghouse of research for parents, educators, law enforcement officers, counselors and caring adults to prevent and respond to cyber bullying.
- **National Crime Prevention Council** provides resources, programs, training and events as well as information on cyber bullying and other crimes faced around the nation.
- **Stopbullying.gov** provides information from federal government agencies and resources to help reduce and respond to cyber bullying.
- **“Teens, Kindness and Cruelty on Social Network Sites”** is a study by Pew that gives a unique look at the percentage of teens that witness or are involved in cyber bullying.
- **Traditional and Nontraditional Bullying Among Youth: A Test of General Strain Theory** focuses on the causes and consequences associated with bullying.
- **WiredSafety** is A 501(c)(3) program and the largest online safety, education and help group in the world. Together with affiliate, [www.wiredcops.org](http://www.wiredcops.org), specially-trained volunteers patrol the Internet looking for child pornography, child molesters and cyberstalkers. Also offer a wide variety of educational and help services; find and review family-friendly websites, filter software products and Internet services. Along with the volunteers of our

affiliated WiredKids, WiredTeens and Teenangels, CyberMoms and

CyberDads volunteer to speak at local community groups and schools around the country teaching Internet safety. The Cyber911 help line provides citizens access to help when they need it online.

- **Stop Cyberbullying** provides information on how to best to prevent and respond to cyber bullying by working with volunteers to promote their message in communities.
- **KidsHealth** gives parents information on cyber bullying and how to help their child if they are the victim or bully.
- **End to Cyber Bullying Organization (ETCB)** is a non-profit organization aimed at combating cyber bullying in this modern age of advancing technology while raising awareness and providing information to students, educators, and parents alike.
