

Cyber Bullying Statistics

Reference: 2013 Bullying Statistics – i-SAFE foundation

- Over 50% of adolescents and teens have been bullied online, and about the same number have engaged in cyber bullying.
- More than 1 in 3 young people have experienced cyber threats online.
- Over 25% of adolescents and teens have been bullied repeatedly through their cell phones or the Internet.
- Well over half of young people do not tell their parents when cyber bullying occurs.

- Over 80% of teens use a cell phone regularly making it the most common medium for cyber bullying.
- Mean, hurtful comments and spreading rumors are the most common type of cyber bullying.
- Girls and boys are equally likely to be both cyber bully and victim.
- Boys are more likely to be threatened by cyber bullies than girls.
- Cyber bullying affects all races.
- Cyber bullying victims are more likely to have low sense of self-value and to consider suicide.
